Dangerous & Difficult Cargoes

Introduction:

Casualty data constantly refers to the loss of bulk carriers due to stability problems and other cargo related issues and similarly to incidents where crew members have lost their lives due to a lack of understanding connected with the carriage of various bulk cargoes and or oxygen depletion in enclosed cargo spaces.
